A Message From The Director:

In the wake of the Parkland Tragedy, March was a month of reflection as we witnessed youth standing up in our community, the state and across the nation with a resounding statement: "March for Our Lives". Though lots of controversy was a result of this discourse, the message was clear by the youth: I want to be safe, heard, supported and most important, relevant. Though there is always work to be done, I remain inspired by efforts of the members from the Roundtable and our esteemed community partners to heed the call and commitment to the youth of St. Lucie County.

If you look closely at the Roundtable logo at the top of the Newsletter, you will note the tag line says "Leaders United for Children". We recognize and applaud the responsiveness and efforts of St. Lucie County Schools, Fort Pierce and Port St. Lucie Police Departments, and St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office, as they united on the issues regarding school safety. TC Palm featured (February 26, 2018) Chief Bolduc, Chief Hobley-Burney, Sheriff Mascara and Superintendent Gent responding to the media regarding security measures. They recognized the need to be front and center on one accord, to address the need for our community to be assured the safety of our youth and school staff are a priority.

Our youth had a couple of opportunities to be heard by decision-makers in our community. Members from Youth Leadership participated in a dialogue with Law Enforcement at an event sponsored by the St. Lucie County Sheriff's Department. We commend the continued effort and willingness of the Department to provide a platform for our Youth Leadership, along with other youth in the community, to speak their truth and concerns. Youth were also provided an opportunity to be heard at the Fort Pierce City Commission meeting last month, as they presented their vision and advocated for support of the revitalization of Coach Fenn Park. Fort Pierce Youth Council (YOCO) Officers address Fort Pierce City Council regarding the Coach Fenn Park Redesign.

<u>Fort Pierce City Commission</u> <u>Meeting</u>

YOCO (Youth Council), which is comprised of the elected officers of Youth Leadership St. Lucie's Fort Pierce branch, gave their first presentation at the Fort Pierce City Commission meeting on March 19^{th.} The team of officers dedicated a multitude of hours to prepare an impactful powerpoint presentation, which the Chair of YOCO eloquently narrated. The presentation focused on their current project, the redesign of Coach Fenn Park, located at Avenue D and North 22nd Street. The officers shared photos of the park in its current state and spoke on its deficiencies, such as unappealing, worn-down, and profanity-ridden playground equipment, and safety issues that include an unprotected entrance to the park. In contrast, they presented photos of a park in a neighboring community that contains inviting, developmentally appropriate, vibrantcolored playground equipment, as well as a childsafe gate at the entrance of the park. The officers enthusiastically shared their vision for Coach Fenn Park and called on the City Commission for their support in bringing it to fruition.

Currently, YOCO is compiling a cost analysis reflecting their proposal for the redesign of the park and will go before the City Commission again in the future to present their findings.








We want to thank the St. Lucie County Communications Division for selecting us as the winner of St. Lucie County's Video Service Announcement Grant for 2018. There were 10 applications and the Roundtable was the only one chosen. The grant provides us one 60-second video public service announcement.

The members of Youth Leadership St. Lucie will appear in the video. Youth Leadership St. Lucie includes members from both Fort Pierce and Port St. Lucie. It will focus on mental illness and the different faces of teenagers dealing with a mental health condition. Many teens are suffering in silence with depression, anxiety disorder, eating disorder, attention-deficit/hyper activity disorder, bipolar mood disorder, trauma disorder, and others.





St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office Youth Dialogue

Nine students from Youth Leadership St. Lucie joined seven other teens from the community as well as approximately 16 Sheriff's Deputies for the St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office Youth Dialogue held on March 1st. This event, designed to facilitate communication with, increase awareness among, gain understanding of, and break down barriers between these two groups, was a huge success. The groups engaged in candid conversation, sharing their opinions of and experiences with one another. Each teen chose a Deputy to dine with and engage in a more personal conversation. The evening was rounded off with a field simulation exercise where the youth and the Deputies reversed their roles. Both the deputies and the teens shared that they were not only enlightened by the time spent together, but that they also genuinely enjoyed the entire experience.


