On Tuesday September 25th Drug Free St. Lucie held a community listening session to identify and prioritize the risk factors and local conditions that exist that contribute to underage drinking and marijuana use among our youth. There were 25 local agencies and over 45 people who attended and offered valuable insight into the process that will lead us into the creation of community wide environmental strategies to address the prevention aspect of underage substance misuse here in St. Lucie County. The event presented breakout sessions that facilitated networking and community conversations among the many community members and professionals that were present.




